### Job Summary

The post holder will produce independent original research on the topics of the 'Men, Peace and Security' project in the UKRI GCRF Gender, Justice and Security Hub. They will also assist in running research activities and organising an international conference on masculinity, and provide support to the Co-Investigator (Co-I) on the 'Men, Peace and Security' project.

### Duties and Responsibilities

#### Range of Research Activities and Responsibilities

- Initiate, develop and conduct independent research, in discussion with the Co-I, for the Men, Peace and Security project,
- Prepare high quality academic research articles for submission to peer-reviewed journals or edited books with leading publishers for the Men, Peace and Security project.
- Assist in collating and analysing primary and secondary materials for the Men, Peace and Security project.
- Present research findings at public events at LSE and externally, including in academic and policy-oriented settings.
- Participate in international seminars and conferences, be willing to travel and submit conference proposals.
- Produce reports and briefing notes for the Men, Peace and Security project as required.
- Assist in reporting on the Men, Peace and Security project for the grant authority.
- Assist in the organisation of an international conference on 'Governing Masculinity', to be held in 2023.

#### Knowledge, engagement and impact

- Actively participate in the preparation for an academic conference in 2023.
- Contribute to the LSE WPS blog and targeted external blogs and LSE WPS Working Paper or Policy Brief series.
- Contribute to the dissemination of Men, Peace and Security project outputs
- Actively participate in collaborations within the 'Masculinities and Sexualities' stream of projects within the UKRI GCRF Gender, Justice and Security Hub and across the Hub's other streams.
- Engage with non-academic audiences, including policy makers, expert practitioners, activists, interested observers and potential project partners.



### **Teamwork**

- Work collaboratively with project team members and with members of the UKRI GCRF Gender, Justice and Security Hub.
- Actively contribute to the research environment of the Centre for Women, Peace and Security
