Job title: Research Officer

Job Summary

This full-time position is shared between the Departments of Methodology and International Relations. This position involves splitting time between software development led by Professor Kenneth Benoit in the Department of Methodology, and data analysis led by Professor Peter Trubowitz in the Department of International Relations.

The position involves text analysis and computer programming in the areas of text analysis, including contributing to the development of the quanteda package for R and its growing ecosystem of companion packages. Specifically, the job involves working on a Shiny application in R based on quanteda. The position also requires background and training in international relations and extensive experience working with large cross-national data sets on international conflict and foreign policy.

The successful candidate with will have extensive computing and applied data science skills with a social emphasis, including specifically programming skills in R and some experience in developing Shiny applications along with experience managing and analysing international relations data. Knowledge of JavaScript for extending Shiny is also desirable, as is a working knowledge of database managers (especially SQL). The ability to work in a team using modern tools and collaborative tools is essential, including extensive use of GitHub and other cloud-based collaboration platforms.

The successful candidate will have a background in data science or a cognate social science field with extensive computing experience, who wishes to gain experience working in a prestigious, exciting, and entrepreneurial environment that offers significant possibilities for networking and advancement.

Duties and Responsibilities

Range of Research Activities and Responsibilities

- Conducting research projects or programmes either independently or in a team.
- Demonstrating the ability to analyse and research complex ideas, concepts or theories and applying appropriate methodologies.
- Designing and conducting field-work.
- Contributing to the formulation of peer reviewed research grant proposals.
- Writing up research for publication in a variety of modes including peer reviewed journals.
- Initiating and sustaining links with external bodies to foster collaboration.
- Presenting research papers at conferences.



- Organising conferences, seminars and workshops.
- Contributing creative solutions to research challenges.

Activities relating to administration and management and/or School service may include:

- Playing a constructive role in the life of the Centre/Institute/Department.
- Managing the activities of research assistants on a day-to-day basis.
