Ability to design and manage a process of peer review for assessing research commissions and reports.	D
Experience of writing up research for publication in a variety of modes including peer reviewed journals, expert reports and public-facing outlets.	E
Ability to contribute to the formulation of peer reviewed research grant proposals.	D
Experience contributing creative solutions to research challenges.	E
Ability to organise conferences, seminars/webinars and workshops.	E
Ability to present research findings at academic and policy conferences and events.	E
Experience initiate, manage and sustain links with external bodies and research contacts to foster collaboration and dialogue.	E
